
DID YOU KNOW?

Camille Tisserand is a graphic designer and illustrator who graduated from the School of Decorative Arts in Strasbourg in 2012. She also illustrated *Voodoo* and *Two Bears*, available for foreign rights.




THE CARGO SHIP


Without using drama or pathos, this book focuses on the absence of dear ones with poetic language and accuracy.

THE MIRROR'S MONSTER






















THE FREAKS



Anne-Soline Sintès was a stylist and designer before choosing to become an illustrator for children's books. She lives in Lyon.


